Dear Ohana of the Newman Center,

There are times when something demands our attention—and all things else become secondary. The plight of the Haitian people is so horrendous that unless an area has experienced a similar tragedy (such as the Indonesian tsunami) it is hard to grasp the enormity of it. We live on a crowded (at least in the number of automobiles) island in the middle of the sea and perhaps once in awhile we avert to our vulnerability to storms and earthquakes. Gratefully our islands have in recent centuries been spared catastrophic disaster—though the tsunami events of 1946 and 1960 took 221 lives and seriously injured many more.

This past week it was clear that money couldn't buy everything—certainly not what was needed at the various hospitals which waited for supplies sitting on a tarmac just a mile or two distant. People died for lack of both simple and complex medical supplies. Thousands awaited death beneath tons of concrete with no equipment to dig or lift—no professionally trained teams that could step right in and “do the job.” Progress was hampered by

increasingly angry and frightened mobs and by the usual criminals seeking power and money with no regard to the agony of those around them.

The response to the great question “what can we do?” is both practical and spiritual. Funds are needed and will be needed for the foreseeable future. An infra-structure will need to be built; a city, a community needs to arise once again. But until that day there are simply tens and tens of thousands who need to be found and buried. The living need to be sheltered and fed every single day. And someday they can begin to look to the future. Your gift to CRS (Catholic Relief Services) or to any of the myriad of agencies collecting funds will help—in the present to alleviate suffering—and in the future, to help people rebuild their lives. If you wish, a check made to Newman designating your intent that it go to CRS will get your funds quickly to Haiti. Thank you.
