Dear Friends:

On Friday, May 28, our pilgrimage departed Honolulu for Portugal, Spain and France. The day after our arrival we will tour of Lisbon and then proceed to Fatima. You may recall that Pope John Paul II was extremely devoted to our Blessed Mother, and claimed that Our Lady of Fatima saved his life during the assassination attempt. We will have Mass in the Basilica and join in the evening candlelight procession. From Fatima, we will travel to Coimbra, an historical city for the Jesuits and celebrate Mass in the Jesuit Church, Se Nova. It is one of the most beautiful churches in Europe. And finally, we will proceed to the famous Spanish city of Santiago de Compostela, named after the Apostle St. James, the Patron Saint of Spain. Santiago is the third major site visited by Christian pilgrims after Rome and Jerusalem. It is a medieval city and remains virtually intact. Behind the altar of the cathedral are the sarcophagi of St. James and two of his disciples. During our two day visit, we have Mass each day in the Cathedral and tour the city.

On the next day, we will begin a scenic drive along the region of Galicia, stopping for the night in Santander, and then on to the Basque country, where we will first visit Our Lady of Arantzazu, a popular shrine of St. Ignatius Loyola. We will have Mass in the beautiful shrine which is at the end of the road in a lush valley near the beautiful seaside city of San Sebastian. From San Sebastian, we will make an hour excursion to the house of St. Ignatius Loyola where he was born in 1491. It is preserved as a beautiful museum. We will celebrate Mass in the famous Conversion Chapel and visit the basilica and chapels in the area where he prayed as a young boy.

Leaving San Sebastian, we will travel to the small town of Javier, the birthplace of St. Francis Xavier who was born there 500 years ago. Here we will visit the original castle which has been renovated to celebrate the 500th anniversary of his birth. We will have Mass in the basilica right next to the castle, and then proceed to Lourdes in the afternoon.

After morning Mass in Lourdes, we will enjoy a walking tour "In the Footsteps of St. Bernadette", and in the late afternoon, we will participate in the Procession of the Blessed Sacrament and the Blessing of the Sick. In the evening, we will participate in the Torchlight Procession and the recitation of the rosary.

The next day, we leave Lourdes driving through the Pyrenees Mountains to visit the famous 13th century monastery of Our Lady of Montserrat. At this monastery, St. Ignatius Loyola laid his sword and exchanged his fancy clothes with a beggar. The Black Madonna has probably Spain's most fervent devotion to the Blessed Mother. The next day we will journey 11 km. to Manresa.

Today the cave where he prayed and wrote the Spiritual Exercises is preserved, and we will celebrate Mass in the cave, visit the basilica and the retreat house. We will return to the monastery at Montserrat for evening prayer with the Benedictine monks. Our last day in Spain, we will celebrate Mass in the Gothic St. Eulalia Cathedral and enjoy a panoramic tour of the beautiful capital of Catalunya, Barcelona. On June 11th we depart for Honolulu.
