Dan Dever Night Presenters

On Thursday, April 26th the Newman Center will host the Dan Dever Night for our sixth year. Fr. Dan Dever was instrumental in starting the Newman Center here at the University of Hawaii. We have become a home away from home for many college students. Six years ago, Virgie Chattergy established a night on which Newman students would connect with the parish members with the “fruits” of their studies. This year’s presenters are:

Christina Viggiano Marzo, M.D. attended Punahou School, University of Notre Dame, University of Hawaii School of Public Health, and John A Burns School of Medicine. She is completing her residency in Family Medicine and will be starting a practice at Kuakini Medical Center.



Her research presentation will be *Improving Quality of Care and Preventive Screening Measures through Electronic Medical Record Utilization in Residency Clinics*. This research looks to improve the learning experience for residents and the delivery of care given to their patients attending a Residency Clinic in an underserved area.



Vijaya Perumal, Ph.D. is a graduate student originally from Singapore and comes with backgrounds in psychology, counseling and social work. Prior to coming to the University of Hawaii, she managed a psychosocial rehabilitation program and statewide housing program for the homeless mentally ill for several years.

Her research, *Gender, Perceived Health Status and Social Support Amongst Oahu’s Homeless*, focused on the health status of the homeless, sheltered population on Oahu and looked at the general health, physical, and mental health statuses of the 151 participants.

The night will begin at 5:30 pm with dinner and then we get to hear and question our speakers. This is an opportunity for parishioners to hear about the work done by our students and to experience fellowship through a shared meal.
