### New Food Pantry

Over the years, the Newman Community has faithfully donated food for the needy. We have become aware that there is a need for food among our students.

Following a study from Temple University and the Wisconsin HOPE lab that found that nearly 40% of college students do not get enough to eat, UH Manoa has decided to open a Food Pantry for UH students who cannot afford to eat. Food insecurity is something many students struggle with on a daily basis. A study by UH professor, Joanie Dobbs, PhD, showed that a significant number of the student population needs a food pantry.

With this in mind, the Newman Center has decided to send the monthly collection of non-perishable foods to the UH Food Pantry. The request list remains the same: canned meat, fruits, juice and soup, crackers. This action of solidarity is another form of outreach and goes hand-in-hand with our mission of campus ministry.

Baskets will be out the weekend of January 5-6. Thank you for your continued support of those in need.
