## Daily Bread Reflection from Celebrations

1 Peter 4:7-5:20 Love covers a multitude of sins.

Mary, a former Daily Bread writer and my dear friend, used to say, "Love covers a multitude of sins ... and so does a good muumuu." Gosh, I miss her. But what does it mean to "cover sin"? Hide it? Ignore it? Forgive it? Forget it? The early Christians presumed that everyone commits sins and that the antidote for sin is always love. Love takes different forms. Patience, kindness, deference, respect are all acts of love. In his letter, James also refers to covering sin by "bringing back a sinner from error" (5:20). That's tricky because nothing satisfies us more than pointing out the sin of others. But if we seek to correct another for the well-being of the other and not to make ourselves feel superior, then it is love. Peter simply advises that our love be intense. This is how we're supposed to live together, to help each other on the path, and to make the journey more pleasant — loving intensely and rendering sin less harmful.

Easter time is over, yet the Church offers us another whole month of major celebrations. I think in part the Church offers these "post-Easter" feasts to try to help us connect the dots. Our faith is meant to be one whole picture, a seamless garment. Our faith does not end with the Resurrection or even with Pentecost. Rather, they point us towards the rest of our lives. And today we celebrate that which especially helps us to follow Jesus every day we live.

This is why the Body and Blood of Jesus is so important for Catholics. We are "saved" when we are baptized. We become God's children. But, how do we live that out every single day when we are still burdened by life's difficulties and by our own weaknesses?

Through the Eucharist. Our only real chance of actually following Jesus, of loving enemies, of turning away from our tendency towards sin, is through the Eucharist.
