

Reflection from the Pastor

Χριστός ἀνέστη! (Christos Anesti!) Christ is Risen! Ἀληθῶς ἀνέστη! (Alithos Anesti!) Truly He is Risen! On Easter Sunday, Eastern Christians greet one another with these greetings “Christ is Risen!” and the response “Truly He is Risen!” What a powerful witness to the Lord’s resurrection. These words should be the greetings of all Christians. The Eucharist that we celebrate Sunday after Sunday are little Easter celebrations. The different liturgies this Holy Week and the Sacred Triduum have invited us to enter fully into the Mystery of Christ, beginning with Palm Sunday of the Lord’s Passion where Jesus entered into his city of Jerusalem. On Holy Thursday, we celebrated the Mass of the Lord’s Supper where we remembered the institution of the Priesthood and the Holy Eucharist. Then on Good Friday we had the celebration of the Lord’s Passion where we listened to the Word of God, adored the Holy Cross, and had Holy Communion. On Holy Saturday, we celebrated the Great Vigil of Easter of the Resurrection of the Lord. At that liturgy, we baptized and confirmed one new Catholic Christian and she participated in the Lord’s Table for the first time. All these events are the reasons why we celebrate. Christ our Lord is truly risen so let us celebrate today and every day with Easter joy!
