Our Newman Club students said goodbye to Fr. Pat, Sr. Barbara Jean, and Sr. Alicia Damien, our Kalaupapa sponsors, as we boarded our Makani Kai Air flight back to Honolulu this past Thursday. The students, Chris, and myself spent sometime this past week in Kalaupapa, Molokai for prayer, reflection, service, and renewal. I had the privilege of celebrating Mass for the group at St. Philomena Church in Kalawao, on the very altar that St. Damien built and transported to Molokai. Throughout the week, the students took turns preparing the meals and leading prayer. As their service project, they spent one whole afternoon cleaning the house, front porch, and van of a resident. As a reward, we got to swim in the refreshing, clean, and healing ocean off of the Kalaupapa pier. I only jumped off the pier once. That was enough. Unless you're a resident, only a few visitors get that opportunity. On the last day, I celebrated Mass at St. Francis Church in Kalaupapa. After Mass, Sr. Barbara Jean gave us a history of Bishop Home for Girls and toured us around the St. Elizabeth Convent and Chapel. Sister reminded us that we are all gearing our lives towards a life of service no matter what vocation we choose. I am grateful for the opportunity to return to the peninsula as a priest. Thank you to Alyce Dodge and Chris Malano for organizing this once in a lifetime experience and to Hale Mohalu the Coalition for Specialized Housing, the UH Student Activity & Program Fee Board, and the Friends of Newman Center Hawaii for the project funding!



Next Sunday, we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost with 40 of our young people receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation and a few of them receiving First Eucharist. Let us pray for them as they prepare this coming week! Come, Holy Spirit, come!

School Supplies/Back Pack Project Drive
May 19-July 21

Newman Center Holy Spirit Parish, in collaboration with the Manoa Women's Campus Club Thrift Shop, is once again assisting the UH Manoa Women Center "Student Parents @ Manoa" with a School Supplies Fund Drive. The collection of items will continue through July 2. The recipients are young student parents at UH Manoa who are challenged financially to provide school supplies for their young elementary age children while paying for their own books and supplies.

Helping Hands Hawaii is also supporting SP@Manoa with basic school supplies, so Newman Center and Women's Club Thrift Shop will provide what is not otherwise being supplied.

Our goal this year, based on both the demonstrated need and on the very generous support given last year by Newman Community members. We are aiming for **40 backpacks for young children, ages K-5th grade.**

Items needed are:

- Backpack large enough to fit a binder (K-5)
- Clipboard-letter size (K)
- Kindermat-vinyl, slim, compact small size, no blanket (K)
- Stainless steel water bottle (K-5)
- Plastic School Pencil Box (K)
- Watercolor paints with 1 brush & 8 colors (grades 1-5)
- Compass, ball-bearing
- Protractor, 12" ruler
- Transparent tape, 1/2 inch X 36 yards
- Glue sticks
- Apron or oversized shirt
- Dry-mark eraser
- Hand sanitizer, small bottles
- Sunscreen (stick preferred for individual application)



Next week's items are: stainless steel water bottle, small hand sanitizer, and sunscreen sticks. We will be assembling the back packs and using the donated money to supplement what has been given to meet the goal of 40 filled backpacks.



The Campus Minister is responsible for assisting the pastor with the pastoral leadership of the campus faith community in an academic setting.

Reports to: Pastor

Classification: Exempt

Position Summary:

- Forms and fashions a Christian community through appropriate social, recreational, educational and spiritual programs.
- Coordinates and/or provides for the pastoral and sacramental needs of students. Provides for pastoral needs of persons in crisis, illness or bereavement and makes appropriate referrals.
- Plans and facilitates faith formation groups, community service projects and social justice programs. Coordinates ministry and outreach to the alienated, marginalized and needy.
- Provides appropriate instruction for reception of the sacraments and coordinates and/or provides for the celebration of the sacraments and related sacramental and devotional activities.
- Encourages and fosters the spiritual growth of students, faculty and staff.
- Represents the Catholic Church on campus and pursues opportunities for class lectures, forums on campus and seminars.
- Other duties as assigned.

Minimum Qualifications

- Bachelor's Degree and 3 years of working in a Catholic Church in ministry related to religious education, youth/young adults or pastoral leadership
- 8+ years of working in a Catholic Church in ministry related to religious education, youth/young adults or pastoral leadership in lieu of a degree
- Intermediate knowledge of Microsoft Office programs
- Practicing Catholic in full initiation required

Other Job Requirements

Physical requirements

- Bending, stooping, reaching, twisting, lifting, pushing, pulling and moving items.

Scheduling requirements

- Entails periodic evening and weekend work.
