A Stewardship Moment

In today's first reading we encounter the Holy Spirit who at Pentecost came rushing in over Jesus' followers like a powerful wind. It must have been a frightening experience for them. But their great acts of prophetic witness began when the Spirit drew them out of their "comfort zones." Jesus said the Holy Spirit, like the wind, blows where it wills; into the lives of good stewards, empowering them to perform wondrous acts of healing, reconciliation and evangelization; encouraging them to proclaim the Gospel with boldness and confidence. All of that is a little beyond the comfort zone where most of us live our lives. This week, reflect on how the Holy Spirit may be calling you out of your personal comfort zone.

Reflection from the Pastor

Happy Feast of the Holy Spirit! What a joyous year to celebrate our feast day with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and the anointing with Sacred Chrism oil upon thirty-eight young people in our parish through the Sacrament of Confirmation. Five of these candidates will be completing their Sacraments of Initiation with Confirmation and first Eucharist and two of them will receive all their sacraments. The restoration of the original order of the Sacraments of Initiation has been an effort in our diocese and dioceses around the United States to strengthen Catholic faith formation at all stages of life and to form missionary disciples. We are part of the second group of parishes to make this transition. Thank you to Anna Viggiano, our Director of Religious Education, and to all the catechist for passing on the faith to these young people and for preparing them for the reception of these sacraments. Congratulations to our new fully initiated members of the Body of Christ!

School Supplies/Back Pack Project Drive
May 19-July 21

Newman Center Holy Spirit Parish, in collaboration with the Manoa Women's Campus Club Thrift Shop, is once again assisting the UH Manoa Women Center "Student Parents @ Manoa" with a School Supplies Fund Drive. The collection of items will continue through July 2. The recipients are young student parents at UH Manoa who are challenged financially to provide school supplies for their young elementary age children while paying for their own books and supplies.

Helping Hands Hawaii is also supporting SP@Manoa with basic school supplies, so Newman Center and Women's Club Thrift Shop will provide what is not otherwise being supplied.

Our goal this year, based on both the demonstrated need and on the very generous support given last year by Newman Community members. We are aiming for **40 backpacks for young children, ages K-5th grade.**

Items needed are:

- Backpack large enough to fit a binder (K-5)
- Clipboard-letter size (K)
- Kindermat-vinyl, slim, compact small size, no blanket (K)
- Stainless steel water bottle (K-5)
- Plastic School Pencil Box (K)
- Watercolor paints with 1 brush & 8 colors (grades 1-5)
- Compass, ball-bearing
- Protractor, 12" ruler
- Transparent tape, 1/2 inch X 36 yards
- Glue sticks
- Apron or oversized shirt
- Dry-mark eraser
- Hand sanitizer, small bottles
- Sunscreen (stick preferred for individual application)



Next week's items are: water color paints with 1 brush and 8 colors, apron, big shirt (k-3 sizes). We will be assembling the back packs and using the donated money to supplement what has been given to meet the goal of 40 filled backpacks.

Pentecost: The Birthday of the Church

Happy Birthday! Today has been called by many the birthday of the Church. Once the disciples received the promised gift of the Father and the Son, the Holy Spirit, they were able to go from the "womb" of that upper room into the world. Every day, and especially at Pentecost, God wants to give each of us a new birth, a Baptism in the Holy Spirit. We need God's Holy Spirit to be truly alive in Christ. We need the Holy Spirit to give purpose, peace, and power to our lives.

The Holy Spirit gives purpose to our lives. Often, we don't live "on purpose". We merely react to things around us and move in many different directions, some of which are away from God. In the midst of many confusing yearnings and invitations, it is difficult to know how to act and what to choose. The Holy Spirit offers us the gift of wisdom and insight so that we might begin to know God more clearly and sense his loving will for our lives. Whether we are deciding about our life's work or about what the work of today will be, we need the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit gives peace to our lives. Often, we feel as if all is in turmoil. We feel inner conflict as we try to reconcile conflicting emotions and seek healing from past hurts. We are not at peace with God because we have waged war against an awareness of God's presence in our lives. We are not at peace with one another because we have chosen conflict and division instead of peace and unity. It seems easier to settle for separation and superficiality instead of working toward a deeper oneness. The Holy Spirit of love offers us the possibility of finding peace within ourselves and with one another. It is like soothing oil that medicates our hurts and allows us to more smoothly relate to one another.

The Holy Spirit gives power to our lives. Often, we know what is right and have the desire to do good. But, we feel helpless in the midst of the enormity of the task of living a Christian life in a world that is often anti-Christian. We realize that just knowing the commandments is not enough. We recognize that just exercising our will power is not sufficient. We need to surrender to the power of the Holy Spirit so that God can be the fuel that powers the engine of our lives. The "high octane" of God's grace is what we need to run the race and to win the prize of heaven. Come Holy Spirit! We need your purpose, peace and power in our lives.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) will be celebrated on Sunday, June 23. Mass will be celebrated by Bishop Larry at 10:30 am at Co-Cathedral of St. Theresa followed by a Eucharistic Procession to the Cathedral Basilica Our Lady of Peace at 11:45 am. Position Summary:

- Forms and fashions a Christian community through appropriate social, recreational, educational and spiritual programs.
- Coordinates and/or provides for the pastoral and sacramental needs of students. Provides for pastoral needs of persons in crisis, illness or bereavement and makes appropriate referrals.
- Plans and facilitates faith formation groups, community service projects and social justice programs. Coordinates ministry and outreach to the alienated, marginalized and needy.
- Provides appropriate instruction for reception of the sacraments and coordinates and/or provides for the celebration of the sacraments and related sacramental and devotional activities.
- Encourages and fosters the spiritual growth of students, faculty and staff.
- Represents the Catholic Church on campus and pursues opportunities for class lectures, forums on campus and seminars.
- Other duties as assigned.

Minimum Qualifications

- Bachelor's Degree and 3 years of working in a Catholic Church in ministry related to religious education, youth/young adults or pastoral leadership
- 8+ years of working in a Catholic Church in ministry related to religious education, youth/young adults or pastoral leadership in lieu of a degree

- Practicing Catholic in full initiation required
