Hola from the Camino de Santiago! At the time of this writing Fr. EJ and I have been walking for four days on the Way of St. James. Over these last four days we have walked a total of 58.57 miles. We have 11.9 more miles to go in order to reach Santiago de Compostela our destination. We will be in Santiago on the Feast of Corpus Christi which we celebrate this weekend. This feast solemnly celebrates the real presence of the body and blood of Jesus Christ in the Eucharistic species. While the Eucharistic species is the presence of Christ here on earth par excellence, let us be reminded of the manifold presences of Christ in the liturgy. The fathers of the Second Vatican Council wrote that Christ is also present in the Sacraments, in the Word, and lastly but not least, when the Church prays and sings. The Church gathers as the Body of Christ to become more the Body of Christ.



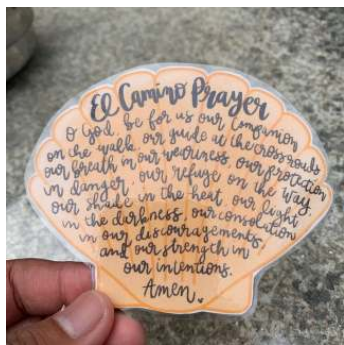

**We Need This Nourishment**

The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, which we celebrate today, is an opportunity for us to reaffirm the centrality of the Eucharist in our life as Catholic Christians. No other Christian church gives the Eucharist the importance that we do. And yet, we can take this great gift for granted. We are reminded of three reasons why the Body and Blood of Christ is central to our life of faith.

The Eucharist is central to our life of faith because it is the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. We believe that when Jesus said "This is my body" and "This is my blood" that he really meant it. This is important to believe because it tells us that God is really present to us. God does not want to remain a distant God, only to be worshipped from afar. God wants to be in communion with us. God is really present in every part of creation and in every part of each of us.

The Eucharist is central to our life of faith because it reminds us of the transforming power of God's grace. In today's gospel, Jesus took a few loaves and fishes and multiplied them abundantly so that all could be nourished. We believe that God takes ordinary bread and wine and makes it into the extraordinary presence of Christ for our nourishment. If God can do this with bread and wine, why shouldn't we believe that God can take us and make us into something much more than we are without God.

The Eucharist is central to our life of faith because it celebrates the sacrifice of Jesus Christ who gave his body and blood for us. The wheat and the grapes are crushed in order to make bread and wine. Jesus Christ died in order that we might have eternal life. As we give thanks for this great gift of God's love, we are challenged to imitate this love in our lives. It is in being broken and taken for others that our love and our lives become truly life-giving.

Today we are reminded that we should never take this gift of the Eucharist for granted by neglecting to come to mass regularly.

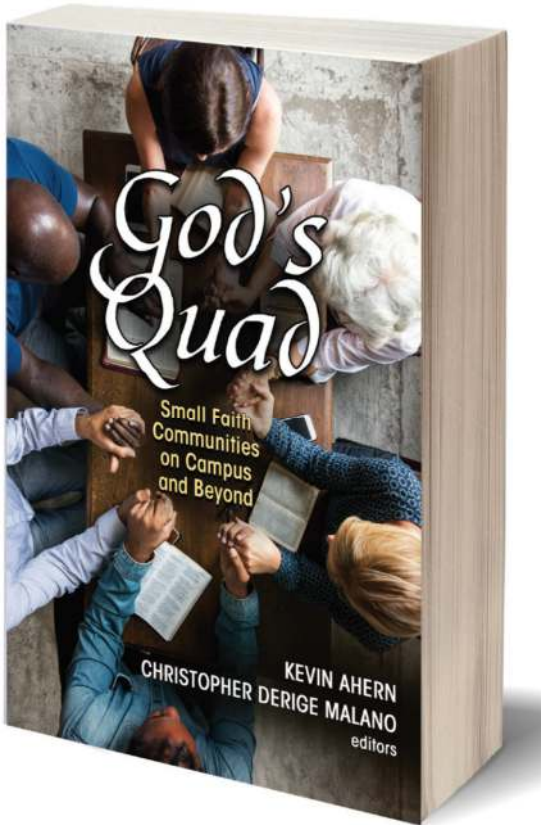
