Reflect

Many moons ago, I was invited to hike the Maunawili Falls Trail with a group of friends. One of them promised that the view at the end would be worth it. I almost didn't go because waking up at the crack of dawn was not my idea of fun. But somehow, I went and chose to trust them. I packed a small backpack with a flashlight, water bottle, and a granola bar (just in case I got hungry).

At first, the hike seemed manageable. But then the trail got steep, and I was huffing and puffing, convinced the end was nowhere in sight. At one point, I told my friends to go on without me. I was certain my legs were going to give out and that I'd never make it back. But by the grace of God, I reached the end, just in time for sunrise. The sky lit up with color. I stood still—partly in awe, and partly because my legs were numb. Either way, the view was so worth it.

We are reminded in this Sunday's readings that the journey of faith often feels like climbing in the dark. The first reading from the Book of Wisdom recalls how the Israelites trusted in God's promise, even in uncertainty. The passage from the Letter of St. Paul to the Hebrews speaks of Abraham's unwavering faith in things he could not yet see. And St. Luke speaks about Jesus urging us to be vigilant, to stay ready like the servants waiting for their master's return.

We live in a world that often rewards instant gratification — quick answers, fast solutions, and immediate results. But we are challenged to live differently — to trust, to wait, and to prepare for something greater that we may not yet fully understand. Jesus doesn't promise ease or clarity. He promises presence and fulfillment. We are called to be ready, not out of fear, but out of love and hope. The treasure we are waiting for is not success, comfort, or recognition. It is Christ Himself.

Where is your heart resting today? What are you preparing for? May we learn to walk in faith, hope, and love.
