
We will pray for the repentance and conversion of our great nation, asking God to save America, especially its children and future Catholics, through the rosary of Christ's Most Holy Mother.

#### Read-Along: Wrestling with God

Are you interested in a read-along of Fr. Ronald Rolheiser's book: Wrestling with God? The title comes from a story the author Kazantzakis tells about asking an old monk if he still wrestled with the devil. The monk replied no, we have both grown old and no long have the strength. Now I wrestle with God. With God? Katzantzakis exclaimed. And you hope to win? No, my son. I hope to lose! But my bones remain with me still and they continue to resist.

In the preface to this book, Rolheiser says he attempted to provide a compass to help us in our search not only for meaning and faith but also a greater steadiness in life. As he says, real faith is not a set of answers; rather it leaves us in mystery, in longing, in desire for Someone big enough to embrace our questions and hold our doubts.

A tentative start date for this read-along is Friday, October 3 at 10am for about 45 minutes and continuing for six weeks. If there is enough interest, a second group could meet in the evening beginning October 1 at 4:30pm (time and date tentative). ## Reflect

We walk by faith, and not by sight. However, there are moments when faith feels really hard to hold onto. It could be when life feels overwhelming, when prayers don't seem to be answered, or when we are going through struggles we don't understand. In times like these, I find myself praying the same words as the apostles in today's Gospel, "Lord, increase our faith."

Today's first reading from the Book of Habakkuk shows us the realness of faith. Habakkuk cries out to God about all the injustice and suffering he sees. We might feel the same way when we look at the world around us. God's response is a reminder for us, "The just one, because of his faith, shall live." In other words, holding onto faith, even when the answers are not clear, is what gives us the strength to keep going. St. Paul in the second reading encourages Timothy not to be afraid, but to "stir into flame the gift of God." This is another reminder for us, whether we are busy with school, work, or dealing with challenges at home and/or with our families. Faith is not something to keep hidden. It is something that grows when we practice it, whether in prayer, in service, and in choosing to love, even in small ways.

What gives me comfort is knowing that Jesus doesn't ask for perfect or unshakable faith. He tells us that even faith the size of a mustard seed can be powerful. It's not about how much faith we have but about trusting God with what whatever little we can offer Him. Where is God inviting me to trust Him more? How can I live out my faith, even if it feels small? May we remember that God does not ask us for perfection, but for faithfulness, trusting that He will work wonders through even the smallest seek of faith.
