HAWAII IMMIGRATION DETENTION

Hawaii Immigration Detention Hotline #: 808-204-5951
(Call or Text 7am-7pm HST)

The Hawaii chapter of the American Immigration Lawyers Association (AILA) and the Refugee & Immigration Law Clinic of UH Richardson School of Law have set up a hotline for those in Hawaii who have received notice of deportation or have been detained by ICE/ Homeland Securities. Legally trained hotline coordinators will ask screening questions and may refer you to a pro bono attorney. Pro bono attorneys may also be able to visit immigrant detainees in Honolulu's Federal Detention Center. In most cases, if an attorney is willing to assist, you would not need to pay attorney fees. However, not all clients can be represented, and case outcomes are up to the federal government.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Peace be with you!

Sunday November 16 is the **World Day of the Poor**, whose theme this year is *"You are my hope (Ps 71:5)."* In his message for this day, Pope Leo XIV says his hope is that this Jubilee Year "will encourage the development of policies aimed at combatting forms of poverty both old and new, as well as implementing new initiatives to support and assist the poorest of the poor." On this day our diocese will participate in the U.S. Bishops' annual national collection for the **Catholic Campaign for Human Development-CCHD**. Through this second collection, support for CCHD enables the active participation of those experiencing poverty to address this complex challenge and forge a just hopeful future for all.

Please remember that 25% of the CCHD collection in our diocese stays in Hawaii to respond to challenges of poverty in communities here. CCHD funds donated from our parishes have contributed to a variety of effective community efforts, including helping houseless survivors of natural disasters rebuild their lives; assisting formerly incarcerated or homeless women with transitional housing and job training; and supporting non-profit organizations helping low-income families build and own affordable housing.

I strongly encourage all to give generously to the CCHD collection as pilgrims of hope witnessing to Jesus, on our journey together toward the Kingdom of God where indeed *the Lord will rule the world with justice and the peoples with equity.* I thank you for your past support of all the works funded by CCHD!
