
From the desk of the Pastor



STATIONS OF THE CROSS



WITH FR. LARRY DENNIS III

Fr. Larry was born and raised in Hilo, where he attended St. Joseph School from kindergarten through his senior year and was a parishioner at St. Joseph Church. He earned his Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from the University of Hawai'i at Hilo, along with a fifth-year teaching certificate in Elementary Education, and later completed his Master's Degree in Education there as well. Although God first called Fr. Larry to the priesthood in high school and again in college, he did not answer that call immediately; instead, he spent 15 years teaching in the Hawai'i Department of Education as an elementary school teacher. After those 15 years, Fr. Larry entered St. Patrick's Seminary in Menlo Park, California, and on May 16, 2025, he was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Honolulu. He now serves as parochial vicar at St. Anthony of Padua Catholic Church in Wailuku, Maui.
