From the desk of the Pastor

As we enter the Holiest Week of the Year, let us remind ourselves of the significance of Holy Week. For during this sacred week, we enter into the passion of Christ – His crucifixion, death and resurrection – through liturgical celebration and personal conversion.

We start today with the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem, and on Thursday we begin the Triduum with Holy Thursday and end it with Easter Vigil. The Triduum is one continued liturgy over the three days.

Holy Thursday is the Mass of the Lord's Supper. The meal which commemorates Christ's Passover meal with his apostles the night before his death. The Mass of the Lord's Supper most especially remembers the institution of the Eucharist — the sacramental gift to the Church of Christ's body and blood, given in the transformation of bread and wine.

Good Friday is the remembrance of Jesus' crucifixion and death on the cross. It is a day of fasting and penance and a time to examine all of the places in our lives where we fail to follow Christ and fall into sin. There is also the veneration of the cross a time for the faithful to individually revere the cross and ponder Christ's salvific act.

The end of the Triduum is Holy Saturday. Holy Saturday is the "mother of all vigils" is the "greatest and most noble" of all solemnities. On this holy night, the Church keeps watch, celebrating the resurrection of Christ in the sacraments and awaiting his return in glory. It is the turning point of the Triduum, the Passover of the new covenant, which marks Christ's passage from death to life.



Have a blessed Holy Week!
