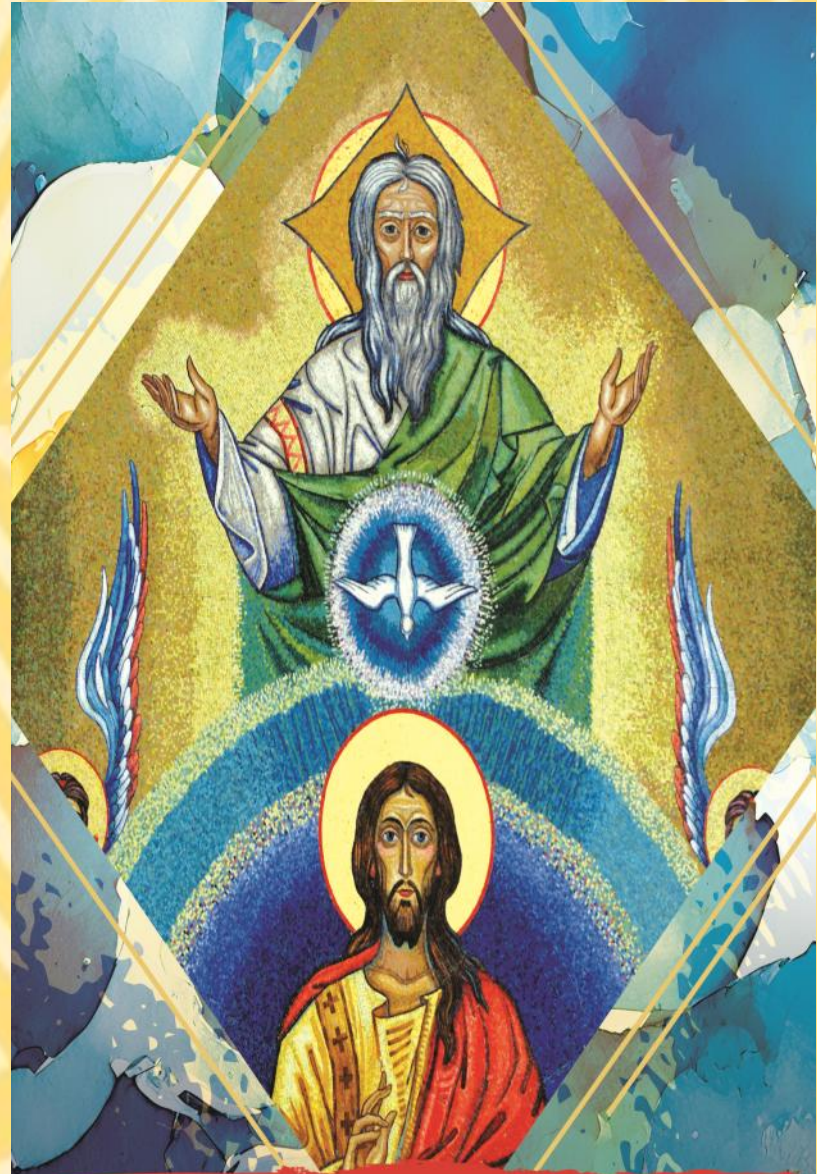

## From the desk of the Pastor

Today we celebrate Holy Trinity Sunday, which is the central mystery of our Christian faith. As Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. And while the Trinity is a mystery beyond full human understanding, it is not a contradiction. Catholics do not believe in three gods, but in one God who eternally exists as three distinct Persons, united in nature and perfectly equal in glory, majesty, and power.

Nature answers what something is (God's divine essence). Person answers who someone is (Father, Son, or Holy Spirit). For each person of the Trinity is fully God, not a part or aspect of God. They are distinct from one another, yet inseparably united in will, essence, and love.

This mystery reflects perfect unity and perfect love. God is not solitude – He is a communion of love, eternally giving and receiving love within Himself. And the Trinity isn't just a theological concept, it shapes how we live, how we pray, and how we relate to God and others. We were created in the image of a relational God, made for love and community.

We are saved through the Son, who leads us back to the Father. We are empowered by the Holy Spirit to live holy and faithful lives. For every time we make the Sign of the Cross, we are professing our belief in the Trinity. Every prayer, every sacrament, and every Mass is deeply Trinitarian in nature.
